INTRODUCTION

INEQUALITY IN CAMDEN

In the borough of Camden there are huge inequalities at play. There is a vast amount of wealth present, and this sits side by side with residents living in poverty. Somers Town is the fifth poorest ward in the UK, and almost 1 in 3 children in the borough live in poverty, with the number eligible for free school meals steadily increasing. Constant construction and development mean residents' surroundings are permanently in flux, coupled with a sense that the opportunities these changes bring aren't available to them.

THE EQUALITY FUND

The Equality Fund was created in 2021 to provide the flexible funding to grassroots charities and organisations in the borough who are working to reduce the inequalities already discussed. The fund supports organisations that actively bring together people from different backgrounds to strengthen communities, and by doing this the support positive wellbeing and enable peoples' voices who wouldn't otherwise be heard.

A key element of the Equality Fund is that the funding is unrestricted, giving the successful organisations autonomy and flexibility around how the money is used. Unrestricted funding is incredibly difficult to receive, particularly if you are a smaller, more grassroots organisation. However, without it, it is very difficult for organisations to be sustainable, and innovate to meet ever changing need.

A SPACE FOR US: SOMERS TOWN MUSEUM

Somers Town Museum has been set up by local residents with the aim of reinstating the rights of marginalised and impoverished local people to their heritage.

CREATORS HOUSE

Creators House empowers young people from underserved backgrounds and connects them to opportunities within the creative industry.

HIGHGATE BLACK WOMEN'S WELLNESS GROUP

Highgate Black Women's Wellness Group supports black women by providing them with a safe space in which they can meet up, socialise and discuss books by black authors.

ACTION YOUTH BOXING INTERVENTION

Action Youth Boxing Intervention breaks the cycle of offending and violence through providing boxing programmes and coaching support.

CAMDEN UNITED FC

A football club set up in Camden by the youth, for the youth, to use football as a means to tackle violence & knife crime.

BE LIFTED NOW

Be Lifted is a grass roots community led organisation with a vision to uplift women and young girls through the power of reading, fitness, music and community led interaction projects.

ASPIERATIONS

Aspierations aims to to build a bridge between business and talented people within the Asperger community to improve employment opportunities for mutual benefit.

AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL CHURCH

The American International Church provides support for the homeless and vulnerable, including meals, clothing and a sense of belonging.

HEALTHPROM

HealthProm supports Afghan and Ukranian refugees, providing services that encompass health, social care and education.

WEST HAMPSTEAD WOMEN'S CENTRE

West Hampstead Women's Centre provides advocacy, intervention, help and support to women in difficult situations.

Creators House is a creative studio in the heart of London, supporting young creatives to overcome barriers to entering the creative industry. Creators House was born from founder Batuala's desire to give back and help empower a community that is largely unprivileged and underrepresented in the industry.

The support has enabled Creators House not only to grow its staff team, but also offer free therapy to the young people accessing other services. This holistic support has removed barriers and meant more young people can be involved.

It has encouraged me to get involved more and also give back to the community.



The first two years of the Equality Fund nurtured some incredible talent in the borough, which is why our approach for 2023 remains consistent.

We are conscious that leaders in Camden have been forced to bounce from crisis to crisis and still continue their great work; from COVID, the murder of George Floyd and welcoming Afghan and Ukrainian Refugees, to the current cost-of-living crisis.

These challenging conditions make it more difficult for the leaders to have the space to innovate, as they are remaining in emergency mode. When there has been so much change, Camden Giving wants to offer consistency and stability in its approach, and we know if we only offer organisations small amounts of money, they will stay small.



A NOTE ON PARTICIPATORY GIVING
