







MAP OF FUNDED SPORTS PROJECTS




GRANTEES - GENDER BREAKDOWN



• Approx. 2 out of 3 sports project leaders are male


GRANTEES - AGE



- 83% of citizen grantees aged 16 24 are from the global majority
- The majority of all grantees aged 16 34 are running football projects

Global majority = a collective term for non-white people of African, Asian, Latin American descent who constitute the majority of the global population


GRANTEES - ETHNICITY



- 70% of grantees are from the Global Majority
- 74 of the 96 grants were awarded to grantees from the Global Majority

CHALLENGES FACED BY LEADERS



- 92% of all citizen grantees have no external funding sources
- Larger sports projects do not have enough sustainable sources of funding
- Project leaders struggle with access to affordable pitches and office space
- Systemic issues include knife crime and police responses
- The leaders running intervention projects are looking to make key partnerships in the borough


