Executive Summary

On the 20th September 2023, Camden's young people came together with people who hold power in Camden to celebrate the the Youth Futures Fund. Their message was clear, there's more that people in positions of power can do to make Camden a great place for young people to thrive.

Youth Safety	Fund and support opportunities for Young People to become familiar with each other and reduce tensions in communities.

Create more youth services in Kilburn so that young people don't have to travel to alternative services.

Exceptional Youth Services

The charities that were funded by the Youth Futures panel are responding to these issues. At the event they spoke about the importance of the young people voting to give them 3 years of funding to develop deep relationships with young people. The funded charities are:

Youth Funding

All of Camden Giving's funds support youth opportunities and all have young people deciding how money is spent. We are currently looking for further investment for 3 of our funds to bring to life some of the ideas we heard from young people.

We Make Camden Kit in partnership with Camden Council, Landsec, JLL and Shaftesbury Estates. Small grants focussed on Camden's Renewal Missions.	Ongoing	We've secured £50,000 for the youth mission and are seeking a further £90,000 this financial year.
The Equality Fund (funded by Meta, Hat Trick Productions, Share Gift and Camden citizens). The Equality Fund is supporting people of all ages with a focus on tackling racism and ableism.	Ongoing	We expect to turn down £900,000 of needed projects this year.
